WHAT DOES "FACULTY MENTORED PROJECT" MEAN?

- A faculty mentored project means the student has sought advice or received consultation on the project from an appropriate Mizzou faculty member.
- It does not mean the project was produced for a class. If you have put together a project outside of a course, but have gone to an instructor to get feedback on it, THAT is a mentored project!
- Students may apply on their own. Your mentor does not need to nominate you.
- Make sure that your mentor knows that you are listing them as your mentor on your application.

How should my mentor help with the application process?

- Provide feedback on and/or assist with drafting the written
- Project Description or Artist Statement. These will be used for selection into the Showcase, shared with guest jury members, and be made available to the public.
- Provide feedback to the student on the project title.
- Assist in selecting images to submit with the application.

WHAT DO I NEED TO APPLY?

- Completed visual art or design project
- Online application
- Up to four high quality representative images of your work
- Title of your work
- Artist Statement/Project Abstract
- Information on the nature and size of your project
